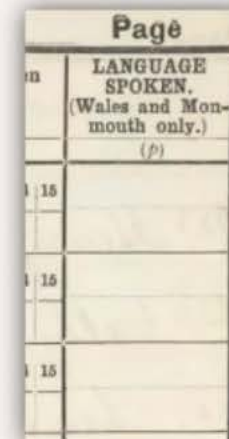



Each of the books could contain one or more parishes and they were listed on the front.
But within the book there were no dividers showing which schedules belonged to which parish.

County – Registration counties used for civil registrations and differ from ancient counties or the parliamentary counties

Registration District – Superintendent’s Registrar’s District.

Registration Sub-district – Each Registration District is divided into one or more sub-districts

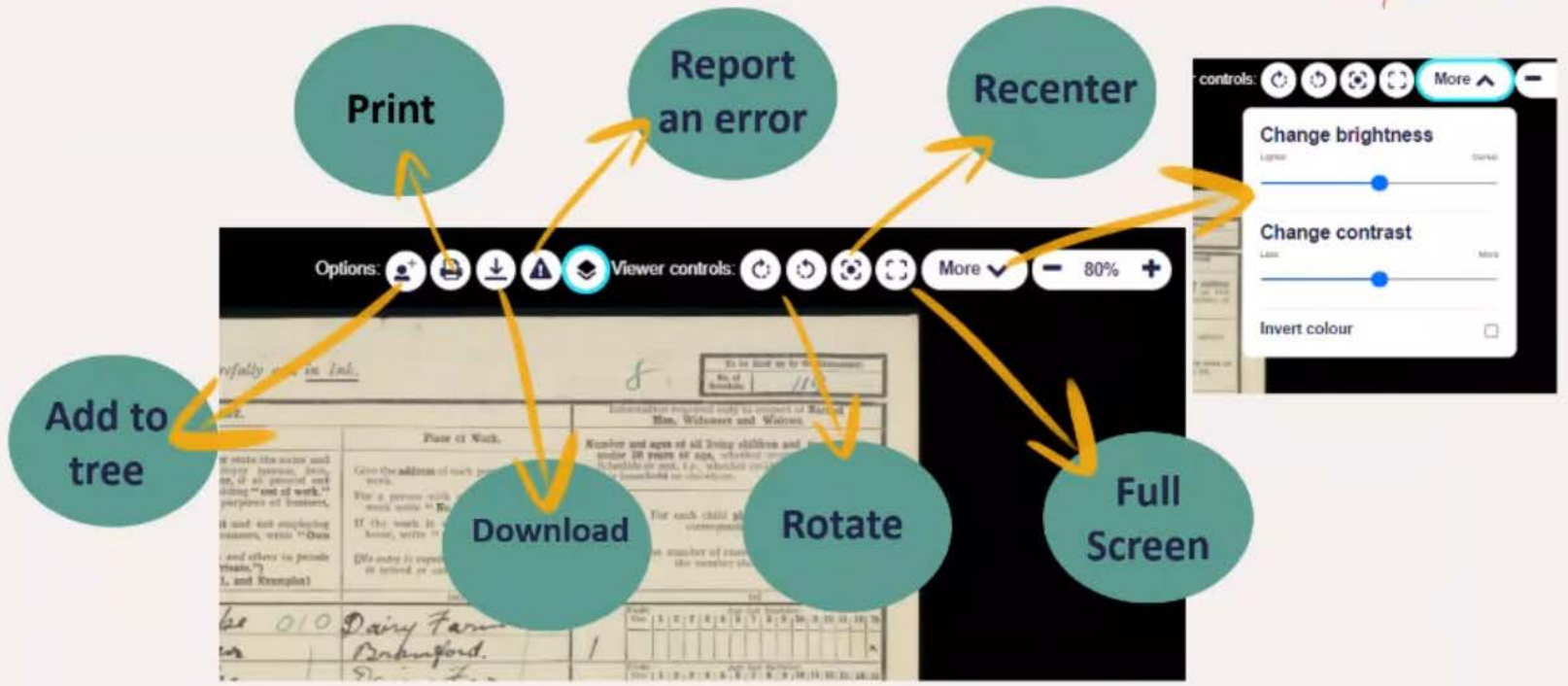

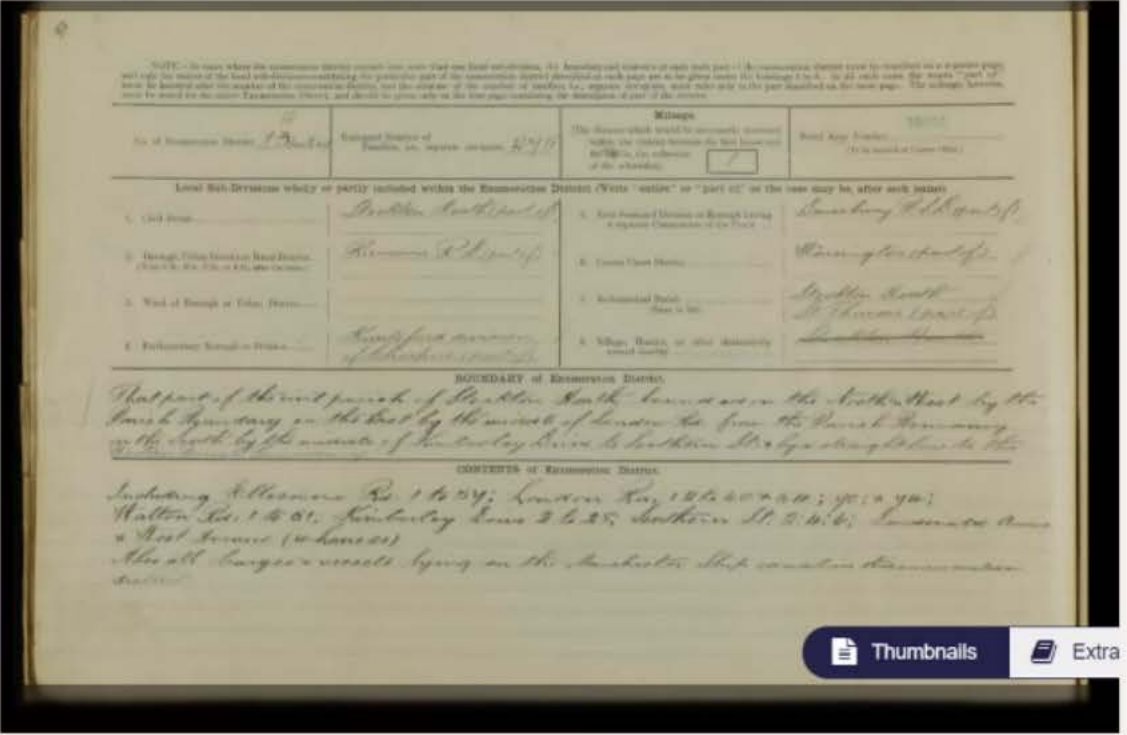
